WSSU ADOPTS CLEAR BAG POLICY

To best ensure the safety of the campus community and the public, and to expedite entry into athletic venues, Winston-Salem State University (WSSU) has adopted a clear bag policy. The policy limits the size and type of bags that may be brought into venues at WSSU.

Approved items include:

- Bags that are clear plastic vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12 inches in height, by 6 inches in depth and 12 inches in width.
- Seat cushions no larger than 16 inches wide.
- One gallon clear plastic freezer bag (Ziploc bag or similar).
- Small clutch bags, approximately the size of a hand, 4.5 inches by 6.5 inches.

Prohibited items include, but are not limited to:

- Purses larger than a clutch bag
- Coolers
- Briefcases
- Backpacks, cinch bags or fanny packs
- Luggage
- Computer bags/camera bags or any bag larger than the permissible size.

The policy also will be in effect for basketball games at the C.E. Gaines Center.

WSSU IS TOP-RANKED PUBLIC HBCU FOR 2019-20

WSSU is the no. 1 public HBCU in the nation, according to the magazine's "Best Colleges for Your Money" 2019-20 rankings, which were released on Monday, Aug. 12.

The rankings identify colleges that have a strong record of helping students graduate and preparing them for jobs at which they'll earn enough to pay off their debt.

"Money magazine has created one of my favorite rankings because they are recognizing schools for the value they provide students," said WSSU Chancellor Elwood L. Robinson. "We're proud to rank as the top public HBCU in the nation. This is further indication of the work we've done to create a world-class education where students can thrive and succeed. Our graduates are departing prepared to be the next generation of scholars, entrepreneurs and leaders."

WSSU is no. 2 overall among all historically Black colleges and universities for value. This is the third consecutive year WSSU has made Money magazine's value rankings.

Money magazine examined 26 measures of affordability, educational quality and alumni's financial success for the rankings. Data was compiled for the ranking from the U.S. Department of Education, Peterson's, PayScale.com and Money/College Measures calculations. According to Money, the average early-career earnings of WSSU graduates is \$46,200 per year, and the average time to a degree is 4.7 years.

This is one of several recent rankings that recognize WSSU's success elevating the social and economic well-being of its graduates. WSSU ranks no. 7 on CollegeNET's Social Mobility Index and is one of only five colleges or universities in the country to rank in the top 20 all five years of the rankings.

The city of Winston-Salem is one of only eight cities in the United States to have three or more colleges and universities in Money's Top 500. The University of North Carolina School of the Arts and Wake Forest University also made the list.



GAME DAY PARKING INFORMATION



TRAFFIC - PARKING LOTS:

Winston-Salem State University Police and Public Safety, the City of Winston-Salem Police Departments and the Winston-Salem Department of Transportation have developed traffic patterns for game day that will help attendees enter and exit the stadium's parking lots as quickly as possible. Patrons are asked to follow the direction of the Police and Traffic Control.

Vehicles parked in "No Parking Zones" or are illegally parked are subject to ticketing and/or towing.

2019 PARKING FEES:

- All general public parking on game day is:
 - o \$15 per space in the EAST Lot
 - o \$15 per space in the WEST Lot
 - o \$25 per space in the SOUTH Lot
 - Homecoming Game (November 2nd) rates are:
 - o \$30 per space in the EAST and WEST Lots
 - o \$40 per space in the SOUTH Lot
 - The SOUTH Lot is reserved and pre-sold for \$100 for the season. Remaining unsold spaces will be sold on day of game. Vehicles must park in the assigned parking space.
 - Towing will be enforced in ALL lots. Please park in your designated spaces.
 - A single vehicle may purchase up to six parking spaces.
 - All parking tickets must be displayed on the dashboard. Police and Traffic Control will monitor parking lots to ensure the number of tickets sold corresponds to the number of spaces used.
 - Parking Spaces will be sold on Game Day for EAST and WEST Lot.

HORN\$ PARKING LOT (NORTH GATE):

The HORN\$ Parking Lot opens two hours before game time and is available to HORN\$ members only. All parking will correspond with a number.

• No umbrellas are allowed in Bowman Gray Stadium. • Season Ticket Packages are \$100.
