<u>Branding/ Fundraising Initiatives</u> – We seek to establish a premier brand for WSSUNAA that is recognized locally, nationally, and globally. We want to tell our story of the impact we collectively have through supporting student scholarship funding, efforts to assist the university's programs, and development of partnerships with corporations and government agencies to foster student internships. As dedicated alumni, we continue to support our communities and assist with college and recruiting fairs, local NAA chapter programs, and partner with other affinities to serve in areas of need. We are also continuing to seek new and innovative ideas to raise funds in support of NAA's operations and scholarship efforts.

<u>Operational Center of Excellence / Membership Growth</u> – The Association is actively recruiting a new and diverse generation of RAMS to support our mission. Having a strong NAA begins with growing our base of membership. A key part of this strategy is assessing our technology needs that will improve operational efficiencies. FIRST HBCU-BASED PHYSICAL THERAPY RESIDENCY PROGRAM RECEIVES ACCREDITATION

Winston-Salem State University, in partnership with Novant Health, is the first HBCU to offer a physical therapy residency program.

Launched in 2018, WSSU and Novant Health partnered to create a 12month residency program that combines the academic resources of WSSU while providing hands-on clinical training with Novant Health. It gives licensed physical therapists an opportunity to elevate their clinical practice and advance their careers.

Recent Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) graduates are required to have three years of experience working with a defined population before they can take the Neurologic Certified Specialist (NCS) exam. However, with a residency, new clinicians can take the exam after just one year – moving the process up by two years.

The residency program has a strong diversity, equity and inclusion focus, especially in health care disparities. Each residency participant performs a research component about health equity, diversity and inclusion.
