
Atlanta Chapter

In October 2022, Dr. Gabriel Russell (Class of 2007 and member of the Atlanta Chapter initiated a scholarship at the University that is geared toward increasing the representation of Black and minority optometrists in America. Recent studies show an overall increase in positive patient outcomes, particularly in minority patients when they are in the hands of doctors that mirror them culturally and racially. The "Eye Bridge Scholarship Fund" aims to assist in accomplishing this by helping eliminate the major obstacle that precludes minority populations from the achievement of becoming a healthcare provider.

The scholarship fund will provide funds that cover admissions applications, admissions testing, and study materials for admissions testing. The overall increase in minority optometrists as primary eyecare physicians means that the gap between health disparities in minority populations will be closed faster and improved healthcare outcomes will be achieved.

2024 Is an Election Year

ARTICLE V - ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE To qualify as a candidate for an office of the Association, the candidate:

- a. Must have graduated from or been a former student at Winston-Salem State University by any prior known names.
- b. Must have attended a minimum of two National Alumni Association Board Meetings, and one Annual Meeting within the two years immediately prior to submitting an application for candidacy
- c. Must have been financial and in good standing for the previous two fiscal years, with all dues paid by September 1st of each year.
- d. Must have contributed to the NAA Endowed Scholarship Fund or any other scholarship fund administered by WSSU or the WSSU Foundation, for the two fiscal years immediately prior to submitting an application for candidacy.
- e. Must have demonstrated and documented experience in accounting and/or finance to serve as Treasurer, in addition to above qualifications.




